On Wednesday January 6th, the women from Riverdale's EPE Program were engaged in an exciting virtual tour of the Canadian Museum of Immigration at Pier 21 in Halifax. The group experienced different digitized materials from the museum, and together they discussed the difficult history of immigration in Canada: from settler colonialism, to discriminatory immigration laws, to the racism that immigrants of colour continue to face today. This was an incredible opportunity for the women in our EPE program to connect with each other and share their experiences. While this pandemic has presented new challenges and has prevented the women in our program from gathering in person, we're thrilled that it has also enabled our group to digitally access museums across the country, like the Canadian Museum of Immigration in Halifax, through virtual tools and platforms that help us to connect.

KAYA JOAN: Realms where they breathe deeply

Realms where they breathe deeply is a solo exhibition of paintings and drawings by local artist kaya joan.

kaya joan is a multi-disciplinary Afro-Indigenous artist living in T'karonto, Dish with One Spoon treaty territory. kaya's work is centered in healing practices, transcending linear notions of time, blood memory and relationship to place. Rooting themself in frameworks of Black and Indigenous futuritist pedagogy, kaya engages with methods of making that operate as ancestral tools to unpack and transform buried truths, opening portals 7 generations into the past and future. kaya has also been working as a community arts facilitator for the past 6 years, and are a member of the Milkweed Collective. kaya graduated from OCADU's Indigenous Visual Art's program in 2020, and was the recipient of the INVC medal, Nora E. Vaughan Award and Akin Studio's Career Launcher grant.

LIDA SHANEHCHIYAN Reverie

Lida Shanehchiyan is an Iranian-Canadian interdisciplinary artist and designer passionate about making everyday life more satisfying by creating thoughtful and striking visual products. Reverie is a visually expressive exploration of daydreaming, a self-healing mechanism that Shanehchiyan utilizes to contend with difficult moments in her life. As a child, Shanehchiyan would use this technique to conjure positive experiences that could detach herself from bitter moments in life. For instance, she often wished to become a mermaid so that she could swim beneath water all of the time. Her wishful thoughts were romantic, innocent, and childish, speaking to wonder and power behind the imagination of daydreaming.

Jagdeep Raina: Chase

Featuring the work of Jagdeep Raina, Chase is a poetic exploration of the interplay of memory and migration, and of how both are mapped onto everyday landscapes. Raised and currently based in Guelph, Raina shares stories of the Sikh diaspora, drawing upon personal records and those of his family who were among the migration to southern Ontario in the 1960s, as well as oral and archival histories of wider pioneering Kashmiri and Punjabi Sikh diasporic communities. Rendering these narratives cinematically as embroidered tapestries as well as works on paper, Raina evokes the textured local and transnational geographies of longing and belonging that emerge in the quest to establish home in terrain that is unsettlingly remote.


AMANDA PISTILLO: Live with Love

For years, I found myself lost in the abundance of potential in the photo industry, and in some ways, I still do. Initially started five years ago, my inclination to shoot analog photos heightened during the pandemic and although I couldn't place why, it felt like the right direction. It removed me from the stress of my commercial practice and had me seeking boundless beauty in the everyday. It took much reflection to recognize the significance of this pull, but shifting my focus away from producing commercial content and moving into medium format film unveiled a necessary change in my approach to creating. Rather than rapidly capturing everything I could – filling archives with countless files, I was suddenly forced to focus on the intention behind every captured frame. It allowed an introspective revelation of an underlying theme often seen in these images – an all encompassing feeling of loneliness and longing. I've crafted a slow, careful approach to my work, finding appreciation in the subtle scenes where nothing happens. Perpetually Me is an ode to the fleeting, intimate, and lonesome moments that pass us by, often remarking of what once was, or what could be.





TAZEEN QAYYUM: A Facade of Beauty and Integrated Fear

In 2002, Tazeen Qayyum began a series of work that fosters ideals of resilience and survival in unfavorable circumstances or unsympathetic environments. As a response to the American propaganda that fueled the 'War on Terror', this series presents the cockroach as a motif on how political warfare has reduced the value of a human life to that of a household pest.

For years, American political propaganda has been presented and packaged in a way to program fear of the 'Other,' just as society has been taught to fear the cockroach. In A Facade of Beauty and Integrated Fear, Qayyum disputes this programming by delicately presenting painted cockroaches in an archival manner. This preservation style remodels institutional education, allowing Qayyum's own experience to inform her audiences on decades of war related upheavals.

Through intricate compositions in the style of traditional Indian miniature painting, the cockroach becomes a site of tension between attraction and repulsion. The adorned carcasses invite viewers in before they are confronted with the immense discomfort of these lived realities. A Facade of Beauty and Integrated Fear reminds us that we must continue to mobilize against

war, racism, and Islamophobia. Many of the concerns Qayyum faced twenty years ago are still pressing today.

This exhibition is curated from a selection of works created between 2006-2009 and has been supported by The Ontario Arts Council.



SUNDAY ARTS MARKET July 31st, 2022

The Sunday Arts Market is a monthly initiative at The Riverdale Hub to help raise funds for marginalized women and youth in our community. Riverdale Hub is a non-profit in Toronto's East End that houses an art gallery, plant based café, as well as more enterprises whose operations support the social purpose of providing employment training, counselling and settlement services to marginalized women.



SHARHZAD AMIN: Bridge Obscura: Healing Bonds

Bridge Obscura: Healing Bonds will have an opening reception on Thursday, November 24th, 5:30 to 7:30 pm. Shahrzad Amin will be present for an artist talk, and traditional Iranian foods and tea will be served.

Multidisciplinary artist Shahrzad Amin is interested in fundamental social issues such as democracy, equality, migration and human rights. The latter scopes inform her art practice that examines diasporic and socio-cultural subjectivities. Through an ethnographic lens, the artist's sensory filmmaking, architectural design, language and visual art practices are molded. Shahrzad Amin's artworks highlight the necessity of global connectivity, and a social openness through the element of arch bridges; these eastern architectural features stand as place-making symbols when overcoming cultural distances.

The exhibition leads the viewer's attention to multiple layers of memory, dreams and time leveraged in the collection through Persian calligraphy, pattern-making, collage and painting. The research that informs these artworks presents a connection between both contemporary and traditional Iranian culture. Despite the political barriers, Shahrzad Amin's practice connects various aspects of Iranian people's lives to a global conversation.

Amin obtained a BFA from Tehran University of Art in 2010 and an MFA from OCADU in 2020. Her artwork has been exhibited in Tehran, Florence, Los Angeles, San Diego, New York, as well as nationwide exhibits in Canada.
